Old Testament: Ezekiel 34: 11-16,20-24

Gospel: Matthew 25: 31-46

Reflection on the Gospel reading, written by Rev Jo Neary

Today sees the third of our sections of Matthew 25 thinking about the end times. The passage focuses on judgement when Jesus comes again. It describes the division of all nations into sheep and goats. And the reason for division? How we have treated the members of Jesus' family. (Mt 25:40) How we treat other people is of huge importance to Jesus. Treating each other with compassion is a matter of justice. Taking responsibility for welcoming the stranger, feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, caring for the sick and visiting the prisoner is our job as human beings. And when we do that, we do it to Jesus.

This passage throws up some interesting questions. In terms of justice and judgement are our actions more important than our words? Do we see acts of compassion as being an integral part of being a Christian, a "non-negotiable" if you like? And where does this leave faith? Action seems more important than faith in this context. How does this passage challenge you personally, what might God be requiring of you today?
