### **Reflection on the Gospel reading, by Sarah Keen**

The Transfiguration is one of the 'Wow!' moments in the Bible. So far in Mark's Gospel we, like the disciples, have seen Jesus the man, albeit a man with very special gifts. Now Jesus takes Peter, James and John up a mountain where he is revealed in all his dazzling divine glory, flanked by Moses and Elijah. Not only that, but God himself speaks to the disciples out of a cloud, reminding them that Jesus is his son and telling them to listen to him.

The disciples are amazed but Jesus swears them to secrecy. The Transfiguration has given them (and us) a sneak preview of the glory of the Resurrection. Only then will others understand what the disciples now know. We too, as we embark on the sombre season of Lent, can draw hope from glimpsing the glory that is to come when we reach Easter. We can take comfort that God's glory is open to all of us. We can be sure that whilst Jesus incarnate in human form suffers along with us, as the Son of God he will lift us up to share in the divine glory.

### **Collect for the Sunday next before Lent.**

Almighty Father,  
whose Son was revealed in majesty  
before he suffered death upon the  
cross: give us grace to perceive his  
glory, that we may be strengthened to  
suffer with him and be changed into  
his likeness, from glory to glory; who is
