Reflection on the Gospel reading, by The Ven. Patrick Evans.

Today's Gospel 'I am the Good Shepherd,' one of the great 'I am' sayings of St John's Gospel, is well loved.

Jesus distinguishes between the faithful shepherd who is dedicated and the hireling who is just there to do a job without any sense of long term bonding with the sheep. Jesus tells us he knows and calls us by name. The promise that we have a trustworthy shepherd who will lead us beside still waters and through darker days. Love that will not let us go and the call to follow his well trodden pathways.

He tells us too that he is prepared to lay down his life.....and these are not just words for we have seen the Word in action on a cross in obedience to his father and in his love for humanity. The shepherd who gives all.

We are reminded about false shepherds who cannot be relied on. Deceptive voices even that confuse us or lead us astray. These voices surround us in every generation.

The flock is the human race not some exclusive little group. The good shepherd knows his sheep, and the heart of the Easter faith is that we are never alone and that he is calling us and everyone to find our place in the flock and to be builders and healers for the common good

The voice is from beyond us, from the heart of the universe, from the depths of our inmost being, a voice that reminds us if we will trust ourselves to him he will set free within us the living water, fresh bread and the best wine.
