### Reflection on the Gospel reading, written by Barbara Simmonds

Our reading this week made me think about the many different kinds of signs that we come across in our everyday lives. When I'm out walking in the countryside, seeing the waymarker signs on footpaths can reassure me that I'm on the right path, I haven't got lost. As we read through John's gospel, we find that he has given us a series of signposts to point us towards Jesus and help us understand who he is; they are intended to lead to faith. The story of the wedding at Cana is the first of these signposts. Mary says to the servants 'Do whatever he tells you.' They obeyed him, and the water became wine; it was transformed. Are we ready to do whatever Jesus asks of us? To see the signs he gives us, and act on them, allow him to transform us? The Message Bible, rather than signs of glory, talks about glimpses of glory. I wonder - do we look out for glimpses of glory, those moments when heaven breaks through into our everyday lives? I think these glimpses are like the waymarkers on a footpath, signs that we are on the right track in our journey of faith. I find one of the verses from 'Teach me my Lord and King' by George Herbert helpful in reminding me to look out for these glimpses of glory

A man who looks on glass  
On it may stay his eye;  
Or if he pleases through it pass  
And then the heaven espy.
